Amarillo Independent School District

Program Name: Amarillo ISD AmeriCorps

Service Areas: Amarillo

Description: The Amarillo Independent School District will have 10 Half-Time and 45 Reduced Half-Time AmeriCorps members who will provide direct tutoring services in reading literacy targeted to at-risk students in fifteen district elementary schools. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for 80% of student participants to show progress toward grade-level improvement in literacy skills as measured by Istation and Get Ready to Read Data. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 100 volunteers, who will be engaged in community service events. This program will focus on the CNCS focus area of education, and will specifically meet the State focus area of youth educational attainment. The CNCS investment of \$303,953 will be matched with \$303,953 in public funding.

Description: Texas Conservation Corps at American YouthWorks will have 40 Full Time AmeriCorps members (as four Emergency Response Teams) to complete conservation and disaster service projects throughout Texas. The AmeriCorps members will make significant improvements to critical ecosystems as well as increase the capacity of communities to respond to and recover from disasters. These AmeriCorps members will annually leverage 750 or more volunteers. This program addresses the CNCS focus areas of Disaster Services and At-Risk Ecosystems. A CNCS investment of \$537,200 will be matched with \$985,000, including \$530,000 in public funding and \$102,000 in private funding.

Description: Thirty AmeriCorps members will leverage \$400,107 per year in AISD support to provide HDT, dropout prevention services and family and community supports in Austin, Texas. At the end of the project, we anticipate increased academic achievement on state level assessments, increased graduation rates, increased academic engagement, and increased school attendance. AmeriCorps member activities will advance the services and strategies identified by CNCS in the 2013 School Turnaround AmeriCorps opportunity: to include increasing learning time; providing ongoing mechanisms for youth, family, and community engagement; and supporting the social, emotional, behavioral, health and other non-academic needs of students, their families, and Austin communities. Afterschool, 55 members will implement Boys & Girls Clubs of America's (BGCA) evidence-based academic support program, Project Learn, in 25 Boys & Girls Clubs afterschool across the state;



and 54 MT AmeriCorps Members will implement Summer Brain Gain, a proven effective program that halts and reverses summer learning loss, at 25 Clubs statewide. Corps Members will serve 1,748 youth, ages 6-17, afterschool and during the summer while achieving an improvement in attitudes resulting in increased academic engagement in at least 979 of the youth. Improvement will be measured by a numerical increase on pre and post surveys. AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 109 volunteers that will be engaged in: focused academic support; high yield learning activity delivery; and special activities around creative writing, science, technology and other academic topics. This program will focus on the Education CNCS focus area. The CNCS investment of \$485,997 will be matched with \$294,749, private and in-kind funding.

College Forward

Program Name: College Forward Partnership for Higher Education

Service Areas: Austin, Baytown, Buda, Channelview, Del Valle, Georgetown, Houston, Kyle, Manor, Round Rock

Description: College Forward will place, train and deploy 95 AmeriCorps Texas members to provide intensive mentoring to economically-disadvantaged high school and college students from the Austin and Houston, Texas metropolitan service areas. By the end of Year 1 of the grant period, AmeriCorps members will have coached 1,470 economically disadvantaged students through college exploration, application, and financial aid; another 730 students will enroll in postsecondary education, 3,621 students will persist in college beyond the freshman year, and 150 students will earn a postsecondary credential. In addition, AmeriCorps members will recruit and train 50 economically disadvantaged volunteers to become near-peer mentors. This program will address the CNCS focus area of Education. College Forward will match CNCS' investment of \$1,109,522 with \$1,109,527 in private funding.

Program Name: CIS Community Servers

Service Areas: Chilton, Marlin, Mexia, Waco, West

Description: Communities In Schools of the Heart of Texas will have 51 AmeriCorps members who will provide tutoring, case management, mentoring, and supportive guidance services, one-on-one and in small groups, to students at-risk of dropping out of school in eligible schools from Waco, Marlin, West, Mexia, and Chilton. Members will also participate in multiple service projects in the surrounding communities. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for enrolling 766 students into the CIS program, case managing 589 of those students with the CIS Model and showing increases in educational achievement through improved homework completion and classroom participation among 432 program participants. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 50 volunteers, who will be engaged in assisting the CIS program with mentoring and tutoring. This program will focus on the CNCS focus area of Education. The CNCS investment of \$367,442 will be matched with \$371,385 (\$295,475 in public funding and \$75,910 in private funding).

Program Name: Keep Austin Housed
Service Areas: Austin

Description: The Front Steps Keep Austin Housed Program (KAH) will have 35 full time AmeriCorps members who will provide intensive case management aide services for the homeless through the Keep Austin Housed collaborative in Austin, Texas. The nine-agency partnership will serve the full range of homeless individuals adults, families with children and youth, including teen parents in Travis County, as well as individuals and families that are at imminent risk of becoming homeless. AmeriCorps members will provide intensive case management aide services, mentorship and other supportive services to help clients develop skills for independent living including obtaining income, job development skills, employment and obtaining and maintaining long-term affordable housing. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for assisting 350 clients with housing placement services, assisting 219 clients with obtain and maintain affordable housing, providing 322 individuals with housing placement services, and assisting 111 clients obtain employment. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage 350 community volunteers, to be recruited and trained to provide a total of 1860 hours of service addressing client, host agency and AmeriCorps project needs. The program will concentrate on the CNCS focus area of Economic Opportunity. As a fixed-amount grantee, a CNCS investment of \$455,000 will be leveraged by funds from our partner sites in the amount of \$225,155.

Description: 50 AmeriCorps members will provide direct literacy instruction and also leverage an additional 236 community volunteers annually to provide vital, high quality, evidencebased literacy instruction services to low-income adults and pre-school age children in the Austin and Houston regions of Texas. At the end of the service year, 2085 economically disadvantaged individuals will receive remedial adult education and English language instruction and 285 pre-school age children will receive literacy instruction. In addition to our work in ESL, ABE/GED, Early Childhood and Volunteer Management roles, this year we will be adding new services in workforce literacy and expanding our dual-generation family literacy programming. Our growing project will focus on the CNCS focus areas of Economic Opportunity, Education, and Capacity Building. Our proposed total program budget is \$1,098,502 with a CNCS investment of \$645,523 will be matched with \$452,979.

Program Name: GRADuation Pathways

Description: In GRADuation Pathways with Project GRAD Houston, 20.59 AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 160 volunteers to provide face-to-face college access and college success guidance and support to students attending 6 high schools and 10 postsecondary institutions in Houston and four other cities in Texas. These communities of origin in Houston, TX are 97% minority and more than 90% low-income. The project will focus on Education--increase enrollment in postsecondary education and improve attainment of postsecondary degrees. At the end of the three year project, 8,100 high school students will have received college access guidance; 1,770 students will enroll in college (an increase of 450); 2,155 college students will have received college success guidance; and 600 new two and four year college graduates and workforce certificate earners (an increase of 150) will be prepared to contribute to the Texas economy and benefit their families and communities. The CNCS investment of \$244,353 will be matched dollar for dollar.

Description: ACE: A Community for Education will have 106 AmeriCorps members who will provide daily, intensive, individualized reading interventions to 2000 kindergarten, first, and second grade students (using a Reading Corps, Response-to-Intervention model) in 32 high-poverty schools in Central Texas (Travis County). At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for 75% of the students we serve reaching at least one grade level benchmark in reading. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 25 total volunteers who will be engaged in supporting projects at ACE schools, building support for ACE in the community, and providing books for students in ACE schools. This program will focus on the CNCS focus area of Education. The CNCS investment of \$1,315,902 will be matched with \$1,787,036 (\$920,000 in local, state, and federal funds and \$867,036 in private funding).
